WELCOME TO OUR GUEST SOLOISTS



CHRISTOPHER AHART earned his Bachelor's in Vocal Performance from Virginia Commonwealth University in 2006. Since then, he's been a tenor section leader at River Road Church, Baptist where he has performed masses, oratorios and other large-scale works. He has performed solo work with Chester Community Chorus, Central Virginia Masterworks Chorale and Old Towne

Opera. He is a founding member of Areadelt Ensemble, a vocal quartet specializing in Renaissance and sacred vocal works. He performs regularly with Classical Revolution RVA sharing the stage with Richmond's very best musicians.



JOSHUA BROWN has been recognized as "a fine baritone" by the *Washington Post* and has performed frequently in the DC area. Mr. Brown's roles in opera have included Enrico in Donizetti's *Lucia*, Papageno in Mozart's *Die Zauberflote*, and Valentin in *Faust*. He was a semi-finalist in the Solo Vocal competition at the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod festival in

Wales. Mr. Brown studied music education and voice at James Madison University, voice privately with Luciano Roberti at the Teatro Comunale in Florence, Italy, and currently with Dr. Molly Donnelly.



SOPRANO STEPHANIE HILL BLACKWOOD last appeared in Carols and Keyboards at River Road Presbyterian Church. Other credits include Dan Forrest's *Jubilate Deo* with the Central Virginia Masterworks Chorale and Mozart's *Requiem* with One Voice Chorus. She holds a Bachelor of Music Performance from Virginia Commonwealth University and is currently working on

a Master's in Business Administration. She serves as a staff singer soprano at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, and Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

EADING OUR PERFORMANCE



The One Voice Chorus 2018 - 2 019 season marks the fifth anniversary of Lynn Gary Atkins, Jr. as artistic director. Since March 2013. Dr. Atkins has led the One Voice Chorus as well as the One Voice Chorus Ensemble in more than 50 concerts, including collaborations with the Richmond Symphony, the Petersburg Symphony, Maymont by Moonlight, Westminster Canterbury Richmond, the RockNRoll Chorus of New Jersey, SoundWorks Men's A Cappella Chorus, the City Singers Youth Choirs, SPARC, Richmond Public Schools and the Black History Museum and Cultural Center of Richmond as well as internationally

renowned singer Stephan Said. He has helped to spread One Voice Chorus' mission of "singing the beauty and power of diversity" outside of Richmond to the neighboring cities of Williamsburg, Charlottesville, and Petersburg.

After receiving his Bachelor of Music degree from Westminster Choir College of Rider University in 2004, Dr. Atkins began his career in music with the Ewing Township Public School System in Central New Jersey. He then became the first student to receive the dual Master of Music/Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from James Madison University in 2012, and returned to the classroom in the school systems in Shenandoah County, Virginia and Henrico County, Virginia, as well as at the Collegiate School of Richmond.

Currently, Dr. Atkins serves as the Choral Director at Falling Creek Middle School in the Chesterfield County School District. An advocate for community music, he also serves as artistic director of the James River Ringers and as tenor section leader for Bruton Parish Church in Colonial Williamsburg.



Thrilled to be a part of One Voice Chorus and the One Voice Ensemble, **RITA SMITH** joined the groups as their accompanist in September 2012. She brings with her many years of musical experience, having worked with a wide variety of choral groups, vocalists and instrumental soloists, both as an accompanist and collaborative musician.

Born and raised in central Virginia, Rita's musical training and love for choral music started as she began piano lessons at age six, and played for her church choir at age 11. Throughout her high school and college years, she continued her focus on the piano and provided accompaniment for her schools' choral groups, musical theater and vocal studios. She studied piano and church music at Bluefield College in Bluefield, Virginia and Carson Newman College in Jefferson City, Tennessee.

Since 2005, Rita has enjoyed her work on the music staff at Second Baptist Church (River Road and Gaskins). Over the years she has also played in their bell choirs, co-directed the Jubilate young adult ensemble, and enjoyed singing in the church's Sanctuary Choir and Adult Ensemble. She continues her involvement in local music communities, with a special emphasis in sight-reading and accompaniment.

ABOUT HARMONY IN LIVING BLACK & WHITE



One Voice Chorus' signature activity to help promote understanding and reconciliation is *Harmony in Living Black & White*, a conversation that begins one hour before each of our three major concerts. Participants are encouraged to share their perspectives and embrace their similarities and differences.

This evening's facilitator, **Ms. ERICA COFFEY**, is Director of Global Engagement and Inclusion at Collegiate School, where she helps students and colleagues to become cross-culturally competent. Erica received her bachelor's degree in Spanish from the University of Virginia and her master's degree in Public Administration and Supervision from Virginia State University.

I have no riches but my thoughts, Yet these are wealth enough for me; My thoughts of you are golden coins Stamped in the mint of memory;

2. Peace Flows into Me

As the tide to the pool by the shore;
It is mine forevermore,
It will not ebb like the sea.

I am the pool of blue That worships the vivid sky; My hopes were heaven-high, They are all fulfilled in you.

I am the pool of gold When sunset burns and dies --You are my deepening skies; Give me your stars to hold.

3. Who Gave My Soul to Me

I gave my first love laughter, I gave my second tears, I gave my third love silence Thru all the years.

My first love gave me singing, My second eyes to see, But oh, it was my third love Who gave my soul to me.

4. For You I Am Still

I sang my songs for the rest, For you I am still; The tree of my song is bare On its shining hill.

For you came like a lordly wind, And the leaves were whirled Far as forgotten things Past the rim of the world. The tree of my song stands bare Against the blue -- I gave my songs to the rest, Myself to you.

ABOUT ONE VOICE CHORUS

One Voice Chorus was founded in 2002 by Barbara Baynham and Glen McCune, then musical directors at traditionally African-American and European-American churches respectively, in Richmond. The group was formed to be an intentionally integrated, non-auditioned, adult chorus.

By 2004, One Voice Chorus was incorporated as an independent 501(c) (3) charitable organization and continues to offer a musically diverse range of excellent choral performances to audiences in Richmond, Virginia and wherever there are those who need to hear One Voice. The mission of One Voice Chorus is *Singing the Beauty and Power of Diversity*. By demonstrating that there is so much more that unites than divides, One Voice helps the greater Richmond community and beyond find the power in its collective strength. To date, more than 900 singers have performed at major concerts and community outreach events for diverse audiences of over 50,000 people collectively in the greater Richmond region and across the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Values and Brand Promises

In 2016, the One Voice Chorus Board of Directors set out to more clearly define the organization's values and brand. One Voice Chorus values Collaboration, Hope, Excellence, Respect and Passion, and these values are reflected throughout the organization. The Chorus members, volunteers, audiences and patrons are promised three things:

- 1) an uplifting choral experience;
- 2) radical inclusion and welcome; and
- 3) exposure, enlightenment and education.

Now in its 16th season, One Voice Chorus has further developed its strategic plan to expand its mission and regional service and to build sustainability in its operations and financial support.

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
