

I truly hope this musical journey will both excite your senses and warm your heart!

ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

Heritage and Hope draws from the many strands of rich musical traditions that encompass American choral music. The selections pay tribute to those who shaped American music and to the inheritors of those traditions who are bringing them to new life in this generation.

The connection between the past and the future appears in the work of traditional European composers (Mendelssohn) and in contemporary composers (Hailstork and Gwyneth Walker). The span of African American influence on choral music is represented by the "father of Gospel music" Thomas A. Dorsey and more recent gospel composer Glenn Burleigh and the "Dean of Black Women Composers" (Undine Smith Moore); and by Ysaÿe Barnwell, a master teacher of African American cultural performance. Other American traditions are present in the work of the first popular songwriter to make a living from music (Stephen Foster) and in songs from the Broadway musicals *Ragtime* and *Wicked*.

Music can shape and transform people. These texts speak to the heart, where real change can begin. This music allows singers and listeners to reflect on topics such as justice balanced with wisdom, the values we share as human beings, and the growth of understanding when openness and respect are present. Each ringing chord displays the positive power of working together toward a common goal. Each dissonance that ends in satisfying consonance reminds us that conflicts must be faced before they can be resolved. Each overlapping voice part weaves a rich tapestry shows us that the strands of our individual heritages and strengths are necessary to build a strong society.

Choral music has particular significance in our history, our present, and our future. Singing together is where we turn for peace, comfort, hope, and joy. May this concert lift your spirits.

LEADING OUR PERFORMANCE



Lisa Fusco, guest conductor, is an adjunct faculty member at VCU, where she conducts Vox Concordia Treble Choir and Vocal Chamber Ensemble, and teaches Keyboard Skills classes. She also conducts the Catholic Campus Ministry Choir at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and directs the Snow Chorus for Richmond Ballet productions of *The Nutcracker*. Lisa

is a performing member and rehearsal assistant with Richmond Symphony Chorus, where she has also served as a conducting assistant and section leader. She is the former Choral Director and Performing Arts Chair at Saint Gertrude High School in Richmond, where her choirs earned Superior rankings in District Assessments and were featured at three VMEA conventions. She holds a Master of Humanities degree from University of Richmond, a Choral Music Education degree from Westminster College, and has completed extensive graduate study in choral conducting, vocal technique, music technology, Catholic liturgical music, theatre, and theology at Westminster Choir College, Temple University, and Carnegie Mellon University.



Jamie Kilpatrick, accompanist, began studying piano at age five as a gift from her grandmother, who hoped to tame the cacophony of a young child banging wildly on keys and mold that energy into intention and art. The seed, once planted, grew an assortment of musical endeavors that blossomed over the years. From picking up the cello in middle school,

marching piccolo in high school, competing in international solo and jazz competitions, and starting a social justice street protest choir, music has always been a cornerstone of her life. After studying piano performance at Boston University, Jamie landed in Richmond, where she found her home playing piano for the First Unitarian Universalist Church of Richmond, a job she has loved since 2007. One Voice Chorus' signature activity to help promote understanding and reconciliation is *Harmony in Living Black & White*, a conversation that begins one hour before each of our major concerts. Participants are encouraged to share their perspectives and embrace their similarities and differences.

About One Voice Chorus

One Voice Chorus was founded in 2002 by Barbara Baynham and Glen McCune, then musical directors at traditionally African-American and European-American churches respectively, in Richmond. The group was formed to be an intentionally integrated, nonauditioned, adult chorus.

In 2004, One Voice Chorus was incorporated as an independent 501 (c)(3) charitable organization and continues to offer a musically diverse range of excellent choral performances to audiences in Richmond, Virginia and wherever there are those who need to hear One Voice. The mission of One Voice Chorus is *Singing the Beauty and Power of Diversity*. By demonstrating that there is so much more that unites than divides, One Voice helps the greater Richmond community and beyond find the power in its collective strength. To date, more than 900 singers have performed at major concerts and community outreach events for diverse audiences of over 50,000 people collectively in the greater Richmond region and across the Commonwealth of Virginia.


Values and Brand Promises


